November 19, 2023: 24th Sunday After Pentecost (9th Sunday of Luke)

We welcome ALL of you to St Michael's. Every one of you is precious to us. *Especially all children*. After Liturgy, please come downstairs for coffee, refreshments, and fellowship.

The Nativity Fast has begun.

This is our opportunity to "re-calibrate" our spiritual compass. Please make a renewed effort this year to fast not only from meat, dairy, and luxurious foods; but also from anger, greed, indulgence, laziness, and talkativeness; so that we may approach the Nativity of Our Lord with a pure heart.

We also use this time to examine ourselves to see where our spiritual stumblings are; to take an **honest** self-inventory and seek repentance and guidance with the aid of a priest in the Sacrament of Confession. In the Orthodox Church in America, our minimum standard is to seek confession four times a year.

Do you wish to honour the body of Christ? Do not ignore him when he is naked. Do not pay him homage in the temple adorned in silk, only then to neglect him outside where he is cold and lacking clothing.

He who said: "This is my body" is the same who said: "You saw me hungry and you gave me no food", and "Whatever you did to the least of my brothers you did also to me" ...

What good is it if the Eucharistic table is overloaded with golden chalices **when your brother is dying of hunger?** Start by satisfying his hunger <u>and then</u> with what is left you may adorn the altar as well.

Today's Scripture

Epistle: Ephesians 2:14-22

Brethren: For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. And He came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to those who were near. For through Him we both have access by one Spirit to the Father.

Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

Gospel: Luke 12:16-21

The Lord spoke this parable: The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully. And he thought within himself, saying, "What shall I do, since I have no room to store my crops?"

So he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry."

But God said to him, "Fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then whose will those things be which you have provided?" So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.
