Thought for the Day: The Orthodox Church has its own liturgical calendar and its own New Year too! The Orthodox New Year is September 1st. This is the day that the Church year begins its cycle again (not in every aspect though). This has been the custom of the Church from its existence. Constantinople celebrated the New Year all the way up to its fall in 1453. The first major feast of the Orthodox Calendar is September 8th, the Birth of the Theotokos, and the last major feast is August 15th, the Dormition of the Theotokos. Our whole year is begun and ended with the life of the Theotokos, the woman who contained Christ. And we, as the Body of Christ, all call her our mother.
