Thought for the Day: When St. Simeon took the Child Jesus into his arms, he was inspired by the Holy Spirit and chanted the hymn, "Now You can let Your servant go in peace, 0 Master. ..." (Lk. 2, 29-32), which was integrated into the service of Vespers. In his inspired hymn, St. Simeon referred to Jesus as the "Light to the Gentiles," it prompted the first Christians to carry a lighted candle or lamp in the procession that day, symbolizing the mystical presence of the "True Light" (In. 1, 9), Jesus, and that He dwells in the" inaccessible light." (I Tim. 6, 16) In the Old Testament, God Himself ordered the Israelites to burn lamps as a sign of His presence among the people. (Lev. 24, 14) St. John the Evangelist presents Our Lord Jesus Christ to us in his gospel as the" Light of Life" (In. 8, 12),
