St. Parthenius (died 3rd century) was an early Christian saint and martyr from Rome of Armenian origin is commemorated today, February 7. who came from Melitopolis in Asia Minor and was the son of deacon Christopher, who taught him the Orthodox faith and tradition. He lived under the rule of Saint Constantine the Great. At a young age he became a monk and was zealously devoted to prayer, spiritual practice, and work. His entire presence was appreciated by Bishop Philetus of Melitoupolis, who also ordained him a priest. Later, Archbishop Achilles of Cyzicus made him bishop of the city of Lampsacus. The city of Lampsacus was famous at that time for its many idolaters. However, the Saint, with his virtuous life, his morality and his wise speeches, as well as with his many miracles, succeeded in bringing a multitude of people in the way of Christ.

Thought for the Day: The turbulence of life will eventually catch up to everyone. And in the midst of grief, if we have not learned to put our complete trust and life in God, nothing will be clear. But if we train ourselves to keep calm...and say, "Lord have mercy", we will be given the grace to go through life and take whatever comes...because we know that the presence of our Lord has overcome the world. He did not come to save us from sickness and death...but rather THROUGH sickness and death...and this knowledge will give us the strength to face the trials of life with peace. Brothers and Sisters in Christ, do not wait. We cannot afford to get comfortable and lax in our relationship with Christ and the Church.
