Becoming Vessels of Grace: God did not create us to be fearful or spiritually empty—this is not our vocation. Our fundamental Christian vocation is to be vessels of God's grace. We were created to be vessels of God's grace. But a vessel is not something that is meant to be put on a shelf and admired, or locked in a glass box in a museum. A vessel is meant to carry something to someone who is in need, like a glass vial that carries a lifesaving medicine to someone who is ill. And a sacred vessel is meant to carry God's grace to those who are suffering, just like the holy chalice, that we'll soon place on the altar, which carries the sacred Body and Blood of Christ that will be distributed to all of us. Our vocation is to be vessels of grace, so that we might bring the love, and mercy, and truth of Jesus Christ to those in need.
