One of the Twelve Great Feasts, and the first major feast of the Advent period, is that of the **Entrance of the Mother of God into the Temple** at Jerusalem. As the hymn for the feast says, the Entrance of the Mother of God into the Temple is the "prelude" of God's plan for Salvation: the Incarnation. The details of the feast (Gr: Η εἰσοδος της Θεοτόκου στον Ναό; Ru: Введение во храмаге) are recounted in the 2nd century writing, the *Protoevangelion of James*, which details the birth and early life of Mary, before the Annunciation of the divine plan for her to be the Mother of God. After God granted a child to the elderly couple Joachim and Anna, it was decided that she would be entirely dedicated to God. And so, when their girl was three, Mary was brought by her parents to the Temple in Jerusalem
